



DOs AND DON'Ts OF HOUSEHOLD GOODS MOVING

Do:

- Empty & defrost refrigerator and freezers and arrange for disposal of perishables.**
- Drain lawn mower gas tanks.**
- Arrange to be present at time of loading and unloading. Make sure the residence is checked (including cupboards and closets) before the crew leaves.**
- Carry with you all articles of extraordinary value such as furs, jewelry, currency, coin and stamp collections, live plants, insurance policies and similar documents.**
- Make sure the mover has a telephone contact at destination.**
- Since you must sign the inventory sheet prepared by the driver, make yourself aware of the remarks made by the driver as to the condition of your household goods, and secure a copy.**
- Take necessary clothing and incidental items to cover your requirements while your goods are in transit.**
- You need to have all wall hangings and window treatments down and ready if you would like the mover to transport them.**
- Contact the claims department of Starck Van Lines promptly should you find any items broken, damaged or missing.**
- Call Tammie Stoica @ 800-326-6556 Ext. 2805 immediately should you experience any difficulty with the mover during the course of the move.**

Don't:

- Move flammables, aerosol cans, paints, ammunition, explosives, bleaches, acids, gas grill tanks, etc.**
- Pack drawers with heavy items or breakables.**
- Pack heavy items in large cartons, or use cartons without lids should you do some of your own packing. Most companies on company paid moves insist that the mover arrange to pack all breakable items.**
- Delay arrangements for storage if required, but most companies do not allow storage unless prior approval is secured.**
